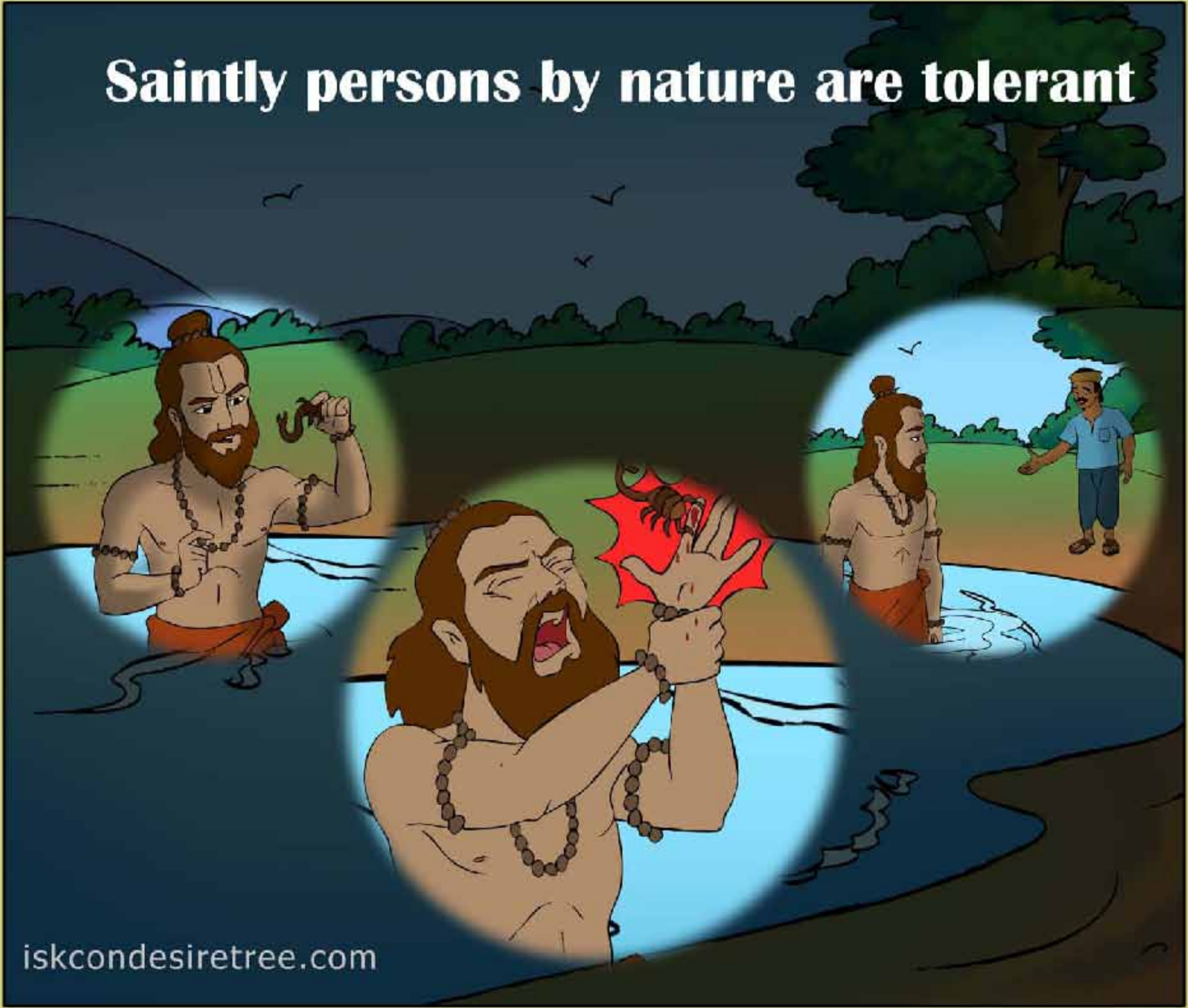


Saintly persons by nature are tolerant

He lifted it to save its life

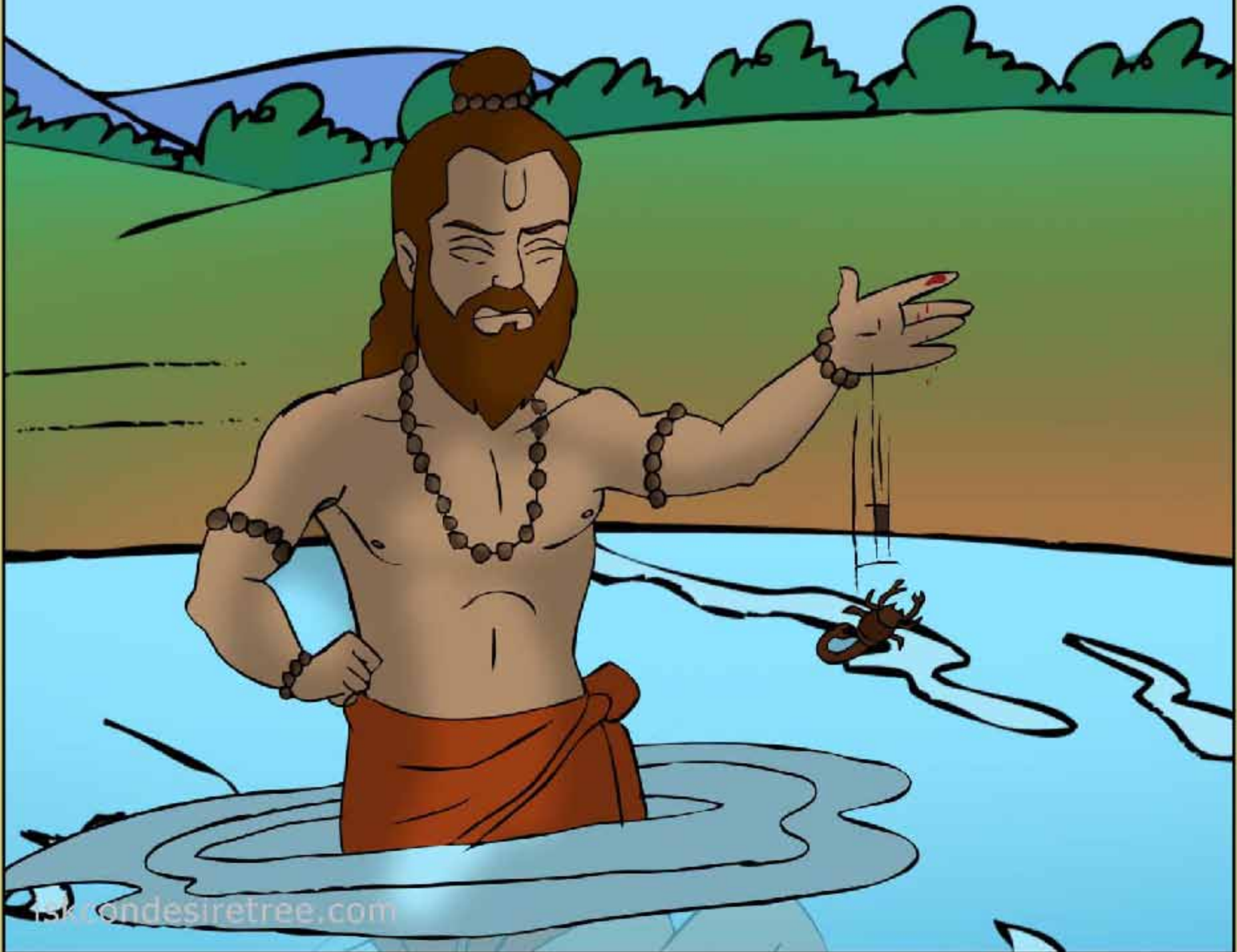


It stung him

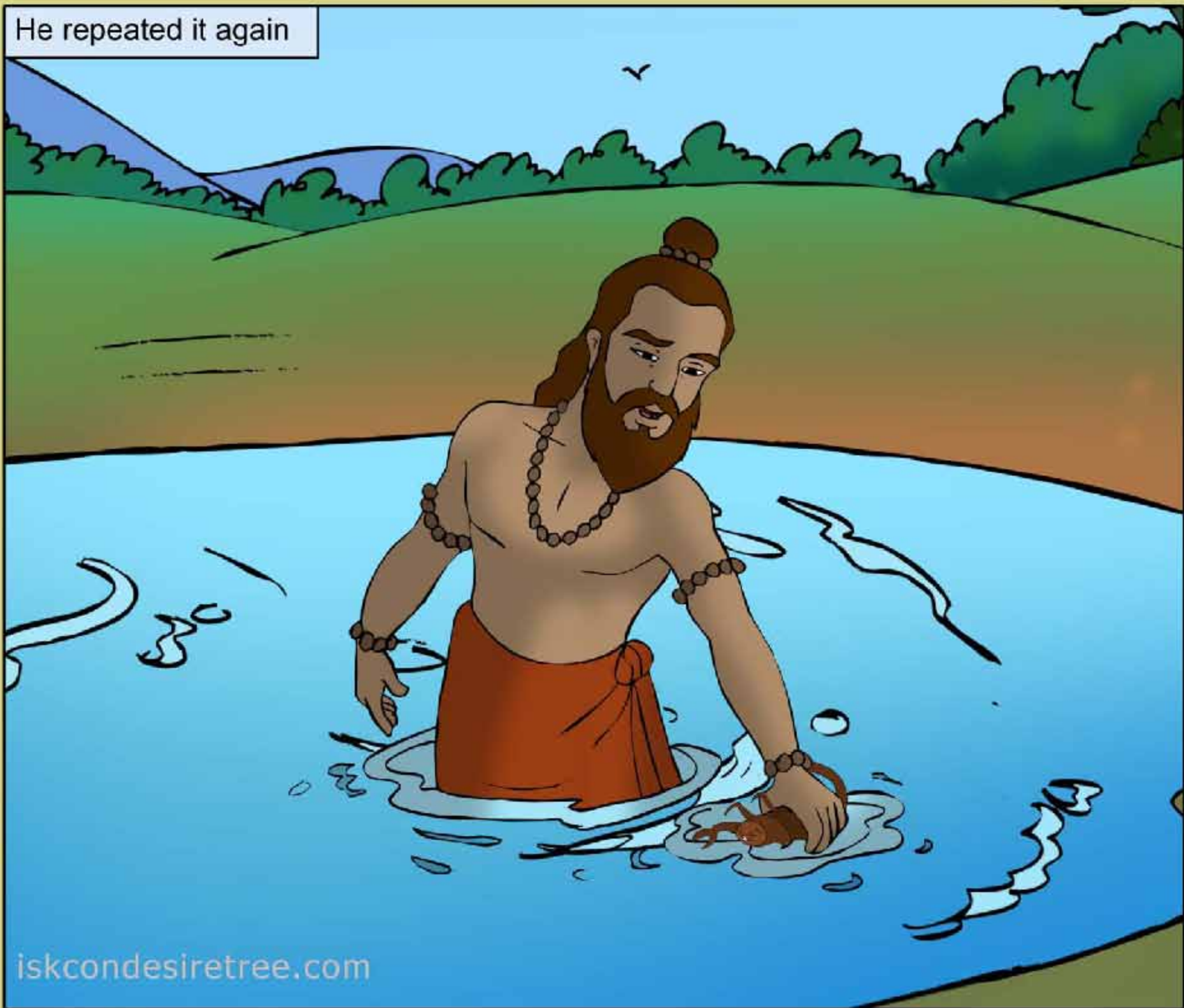
Aaah!



Due to the pain he experienced he immediately dropped it



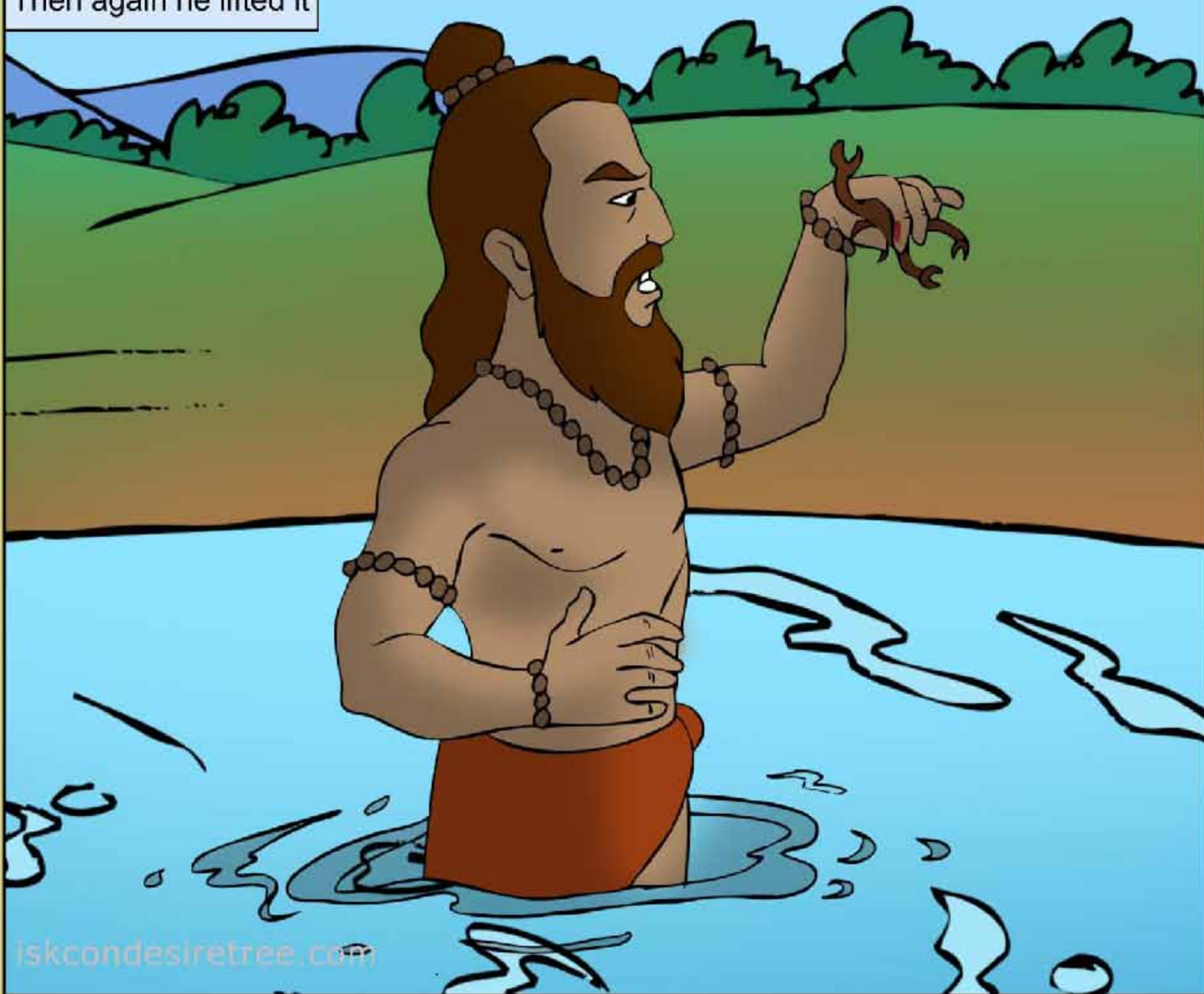
He repeated it again



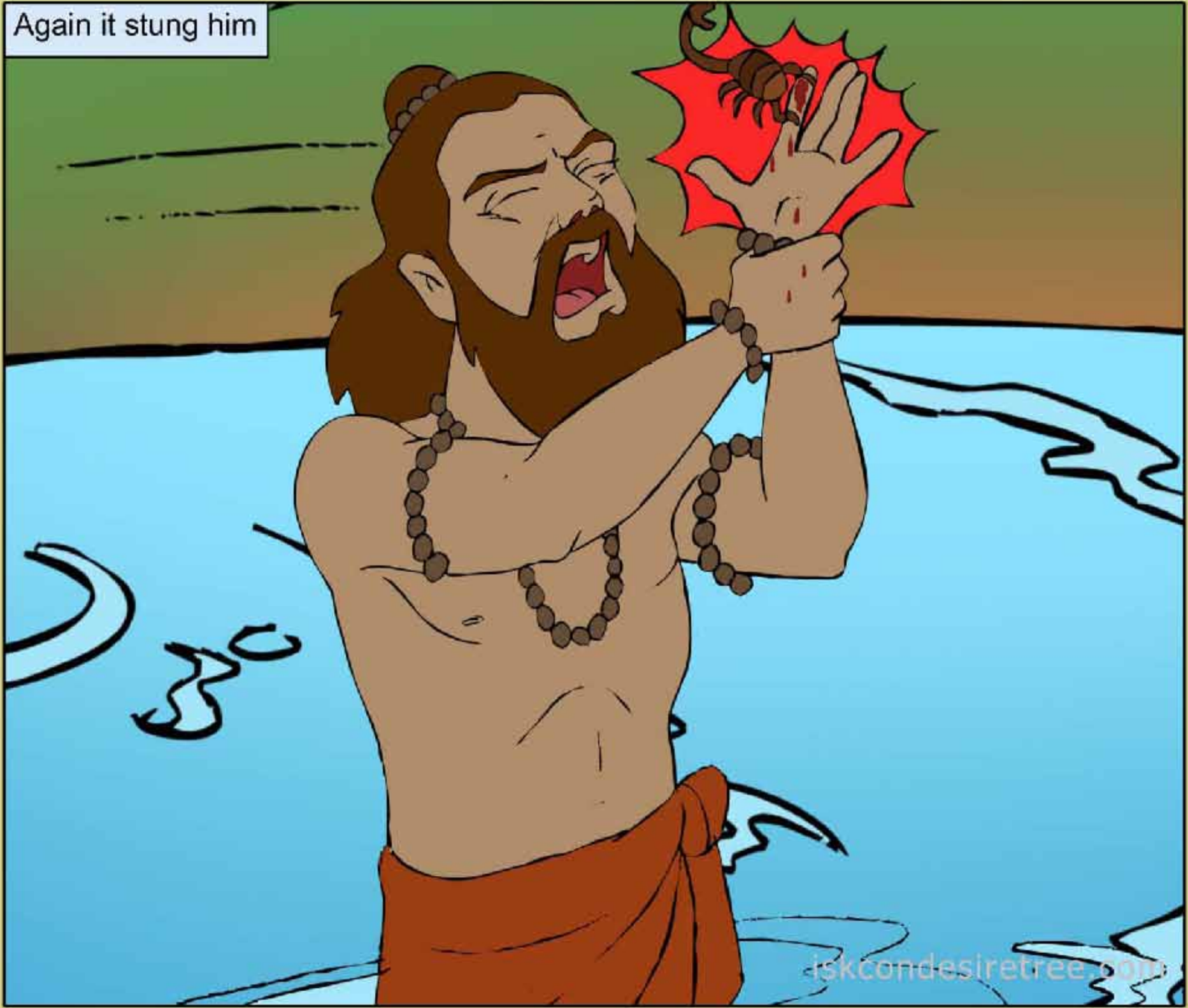
Outch! My hand

Again it stung him



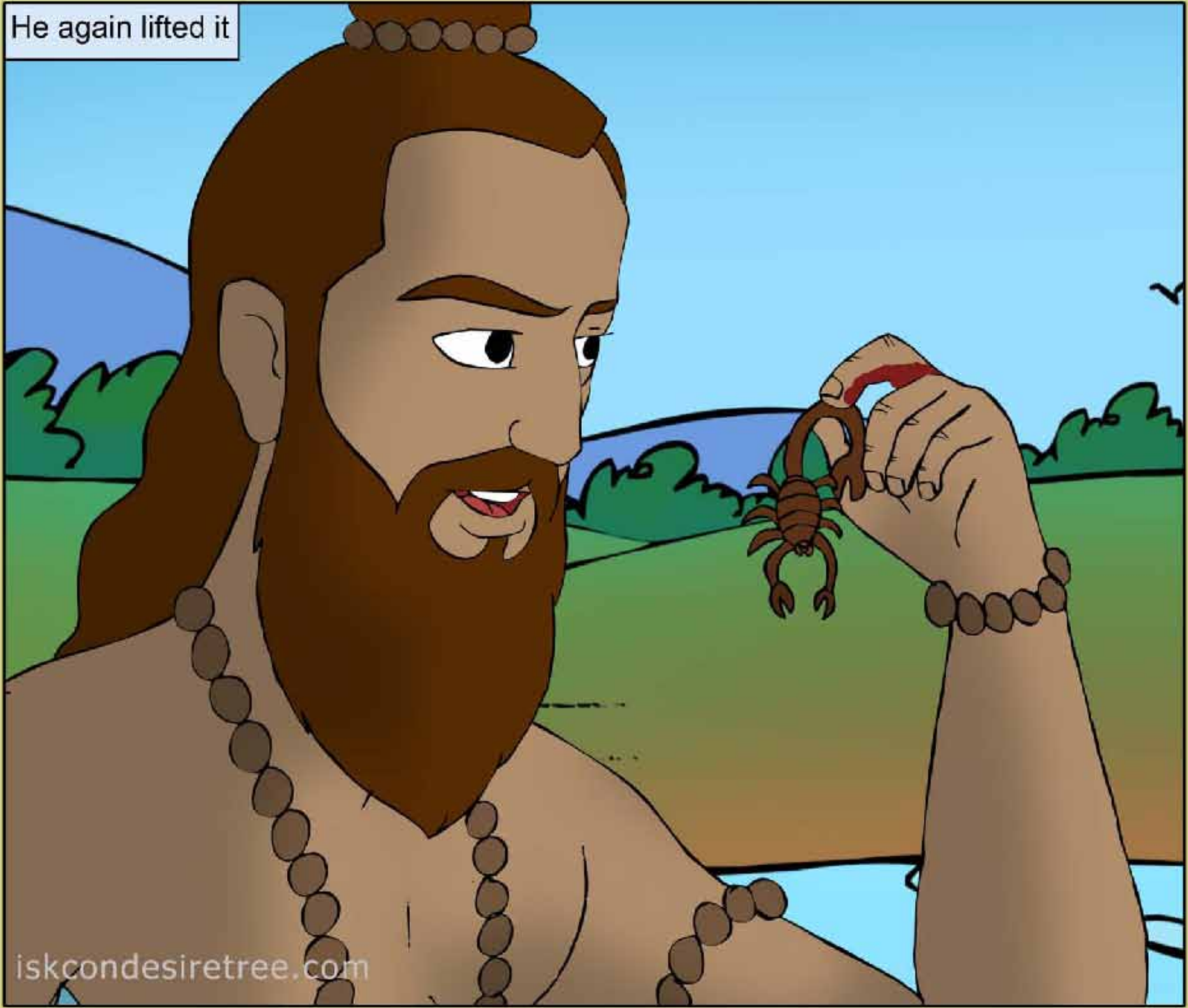
And again he dropped it



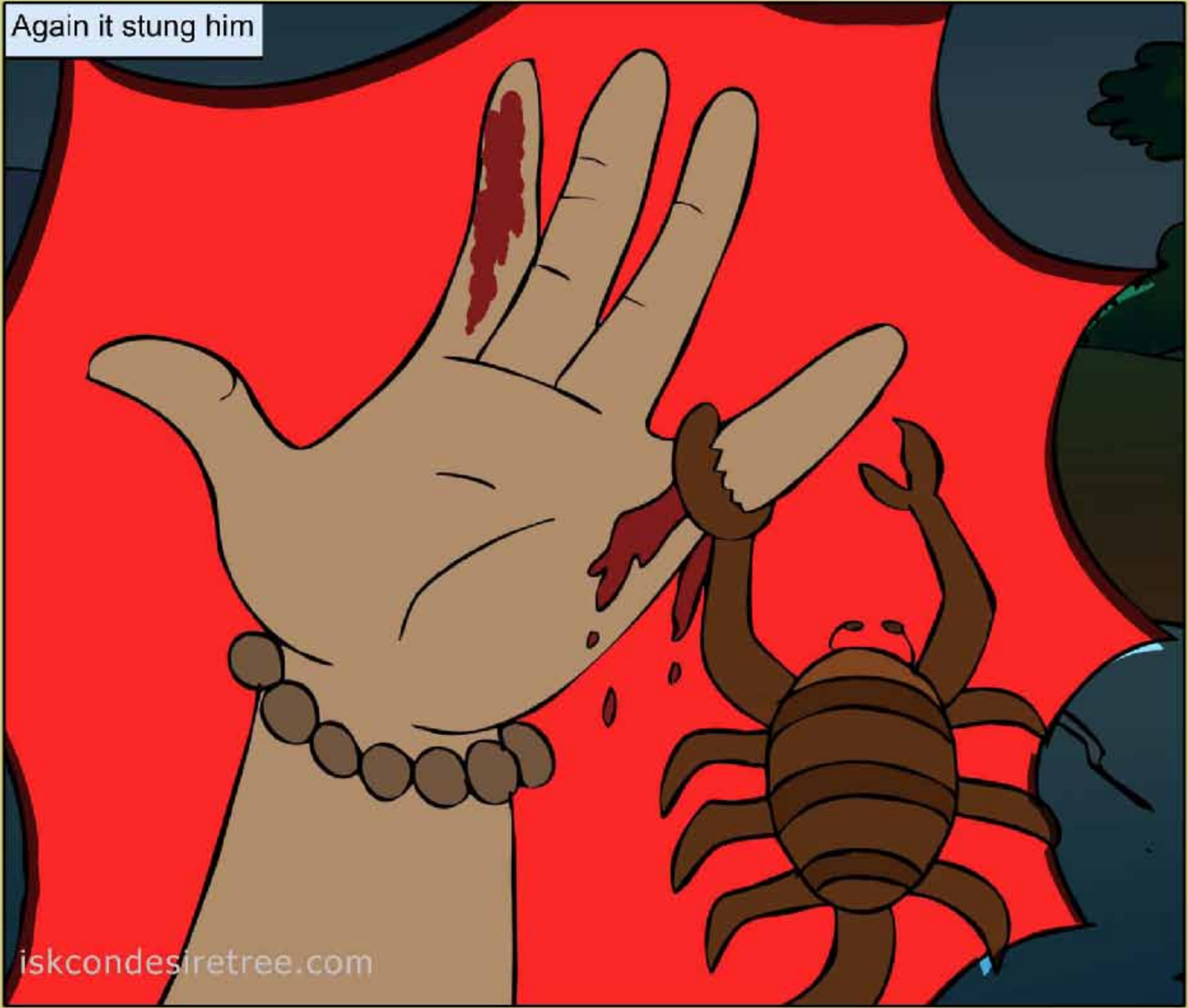
Again he lifted it

Again it stung him






Outch! Its so painful
